The river Yarty was appreciated with its little pools and water weed, as were the desirable residences scattered along its length including a very upmarket barbecue.

Fortunately none of the cattle met on the recce, which included a herd of frisky bullocks, were on our path this time. We did have an animated discussion as to the best way to deal with over friendly bullocks, then it was back to the car park and picnic lunch in the grounds of the village hall.
